- High academic performance is not required but will be considered.
- Each applicant will sign a letter of intent to contribute to The Donald B. and Dorothy L. Stabler Foundation Scholarship Fund at Marywood University in an amount equal to the amounts received for his or her education. It is understood this is a "debt of conscience" and not a legal obligation.
- Upon graduation, each recipient will be provided with a copy of the Statement of Beliefs, as stated in Mr. Stabler's Last Will and Testament.
